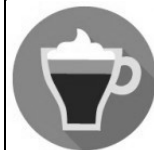

a tree surgeon who has undertaken to work on the trees to make them safer and more aesthetically pleasing.

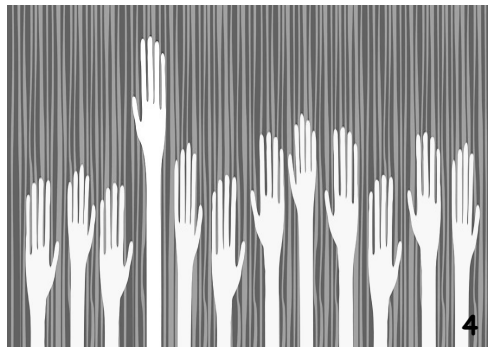
We also must thank Liam for his work on the trees both sides of the footpath from Church Meadow to the Church. What a difference it has made!

SHED AND GARAGE SECURITY

Securing your shed and garage is essential, not only to protect what is stored within it, but also to prevent anything from your shed/garage being used to force entry or cause damage to your house or car. There are some simple steps below that you can take to enhance the security of your shed or garage.

Top Tips

- Always keep your shed or garage locked and fit a monitored alarm, that could be linked to your house, or use an independent monitored alarm (this could include a battery operated texting alarm).
- Use coach bolts or non-tamper screws to fasten hinges, hasps and staples, or a padbar.
- Match a bolt threaded metal plate on the inside of the shed to the outside hasp to provide extra reinforcement from the inside.
- Avoid windows, if they have to be in place, place security grilles on them and black the windows out so items are not on view.
- Use two good quality closed shackle padlocks to secure the shed.
- Avoid storing high value items in the shed.
- Fit either a ground anchor, or stay safe to secure valuable items too.
- Security mark property and register it with www.immobilise.com
- Add ground mounted locking bars to enhance security on 'up and over' garage doors.
- To prevent garage doors from being forced open, install a Sold

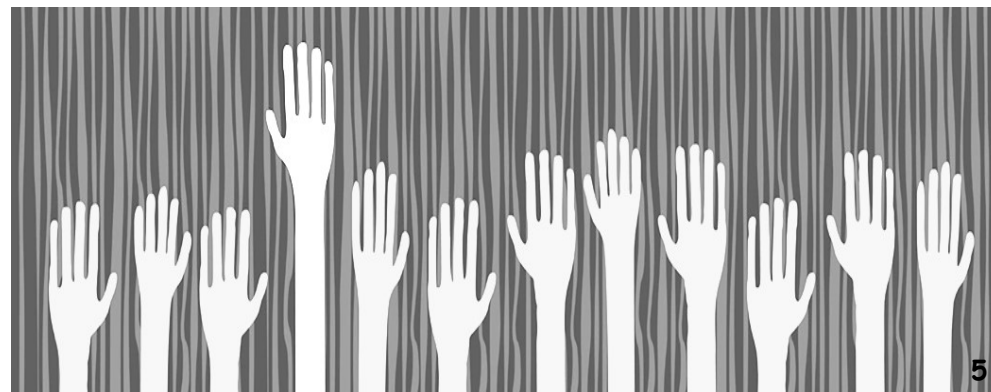

ST BARTHOLOMEW'S CHURCH

Although our churches are closed at this present time, the Church with a capital 'C' is certainly not. Services are no longer of course taking place in our buildings, but daily they are streamlined by the Diocese and can be found on the 'A Church Near You' website. I am grateful to Reverend Jay Price, our Deanery Synod Secretary, for being responsible for much of the work, I would have struggled without her assistance. Jay has had overall responsibility for connecting up all our 28 churches within the Deanery!

Along with this my own personal communication details are posted outside all of the Benefice churches, and I am always available for practical help or merely a listening ear.

Judging by the communications I have received, along with conversations had with other Ordained colleagues, not to mention letters to the Church Times; there is some disquiet and obvious upset that our churches remain closed. As a Priest who 'says' the Daily Offices of Morning and Evening Prayer in church, my personal disappointment is immense.

However, our Bishops and Archbishops have not made these decisions lightly, and I fully accept and support their actions. As with

our politicians, religious leaders are having to make difficult choices at this present time, and I suspect most of us are only too glad we are not being called upon to make them ourselves. Our church leaders are simply attempting to work alongside other faith leaders and to assist the Government in its work to 'defeat' Coronavirus.

I fully realise that all of this is even more distressing to those who have had to postpone weddings, and those left unsure of when their marriages will take place in the future, certainly in the format they would hope for; I am deeply sorry that I have no answer at the moment. Sadly funerals are not taking place in church, but at the graveside or Crematorium, with restricted numbers. Baptisms, unless emergencies, are also postponed.

It may well be of little consolation, but this is not the first time our churches have been closed. Eight hundred years ago, when our churches were governed from Rome (The Church of England was yet to be 'invented!'), in a bitter dispute with King John, Pope Innocent III, arguably the most powerful person in Europe at the time, issued an 'Interdict' across

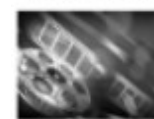

4 SEASONS

The spring has been like no other. All of nature has rejoiced in the “lockdown” - clean air, clear blue skies, reduced noise, and the sudden lifting of most of the usual threats from human activity. As the prospects of a return to normal are pushed ever further away I sense a mood of frustration and fatalism rather than fear. More than ever I am grateful for my family and for the entertainment provided by radio, TV and internet, not to mention my tranche of the borrowed billions (I am “furloughed”, that’s on top of my pension). There will come a reckoning – it feels a bit like a free lunch on a sinking ship.

Where has all the flour gone? (Sing it with me). Flour was one of the first products to disappear from supermarket shelves and it is still hard to find. My Googling reveals that although more of us are baking there is no shortage, except that there is not enough of the little bags that supermarkets prefer. Most flour goes to the major bakeries and food factories either in bulk carriers or sacks, only a few mills are geared up for supermarket packaging. They are working round the clock – but it isn’t getting to Tesco and it seems there may be more to this than they want to tell us. If you are making bread and can’t get strong white flour, you can use plain. There will be a slight difference in the loaf – but it will be perfectly acceptable.
