

Book Review: I'll Take That One. An Evacuee's Childhood

Kitty Baxter, 2023. £8.99 Available from the library.

I think some of you could tell your own stories of evacuation in WW2, for you this book will stir many memories of hardship and loss as well as everyday life. Kitty was sent to rural Sussex during the "phoney war" where her experiences were mainly positive, but returned to London where she survived the blitz. She was evacuated again to Blackpool when the flying bombs were falling, until she was "rescued" by her mother. Her comfortable billet was a busy brothel. It is an inspiring story of courage, love and the kindness (sometimes the cruelty) of strangers, I think you will enjoy it whether or not your memory stretches back to the days before teabags and telly.




